Better Housing For All

We support the proposed housing development north of the M27. There is a desperate need for housing in Fareham and especially affordable housing, that is, housing that is available to people on low and median incomes. This scheme will also safeguard existing open spaces within Fareham.

If we do not plan for the future our children and grandchildren will be unable to buy homes locally and will be forced to move away from the town in which they grew up.



Recent figures given on BBCs South Today show a dramatic fall in the number of starts for affordable housing in Hampshire

and the Isle of Wight. In 2010-11 there were 1717 starts and in 2011-12 only 519.

Now that this development has approval Labour will demand a good mix of all types of housing, including a high proportion of affordable and social housing (housing provided by the council or housing associations). We will also demand that adequate schools, doctor's and dentist's surgeries, shops community facilities and road improvements are provided.

One Nation NHS

Shadow Health Secretary Andy Burnham has set out Labour's vision for health and social care in a recent speech at the Kings Fund.

In an ageing society our current health and care system is under increasing pressure to deal with an expanding number of complex needs. Andy acknowledged that historically there have been three systems in place to deal with differing aspects of health and care - physical health in hospitals, mental health often in separate services on the fringes of the NHS, and social care led by council run services.

Explaining why this structure needs to be addressed, he said that separating a person's needs into physical, mental and social is leading to increasingly familiar care problems and an inefficient use of resources.

Andy opened Labour's consultation on a full integration of health and social care within a single pooled budget. He outlined his vision for what 'whole person care' would look like - provision for the barriers between mental and physical health to be tackled by giving them equal priority,
