Nationally Labour has proposed: a £2bn tax on bank bonuses to fund jobs for the young; bring forward investment to boost employment; a temporary reversal of the 2.5% VAT increase; a one year cut in VAT to 5% for home improvements and a National Insurance tax break for small businesses.





Long Wait for Beds

Tens of thousands of NHS patients are having to wait up to 12 hours before they are given a hospital bed.

The number of patients in England who waited between 4 and 12 hours for a bed once a decision to admit them had been made

has risen by nearly a third in just one year according to Nursing Times.

NHS Trusts are required to admit or discharge patients within four hours.

Labour Says NO to Housing South of Longfield Avenue.

Following the government's relaxation of planning rules there is a real danger that the recently proposed development south of Longfield Avenue could be on the cards again.

Due to the newly approved development north of the M27 (SDA) Labour believes there is no justification for another large development in the Borough. Yes we need housing (see article on front page) but we see the SDA as providing most of the housing need within Fareham for the foreseeable future and protecting green space.

Labour is pledged to fight any plans here.



In Brief

The town centre is to get improvements from a £200,000 fund. improvements will include; a new web site; improved signage; murals; minor shop repairs and scheme to promote new businesses.

Park Lane Recreation Park is to receive a £780,000 improvement package: to upgrade the childrens' play area; expand the skate park; install outdoor gym equipment and new flood lighting.
